Fiscal Year 2009 Project Requests (Commerce, Justice, Science, and Related Agencies)

- \$250,000 to improve interoperable communications for public safety and emergency management for local Law Enforcement in Pierce County, Wash.; Rainier Communications Commission, Lakewood, Wash.
- \$500,000 for a North Thurston county regional computerized Records Management System that would provide regional law enforcement agencies with current technology and replace the current severely outdated system; City of Lacey.
- \$500,000 for the Crystal Judson Family Justice Center Specialized Services; Crystal Judson Family Justice Center, City of Tacoma/Pierce County.
- \$1 million for the Pierce County Regional Gang Prevention Initiative; Safe Streets Campaign, Tacoma, Wash.
- \$1.5 million to help the Puyallup Tribe of Indians construct a new Justice Center that will provide policing, court, emergency preparedness and detention services for the Puyallup Reservation and surrounded communities within Pierce County, Wash.; Puyallup Tribe.
- \$1.5 million to build a wireless data hub that will integrate all 39 city Police Departments and a total of 46 law enforcement agencies in King County/Region Six; King County Sheriff's Office.
- \$3.5 million for the Valley Cities Public Safety Regional Wireless Broadband Network. Federal funding will support an upgrade for 911 communications for the public safety community to an IP-based system though the installation of wired fiber communications; City of Auburn.
