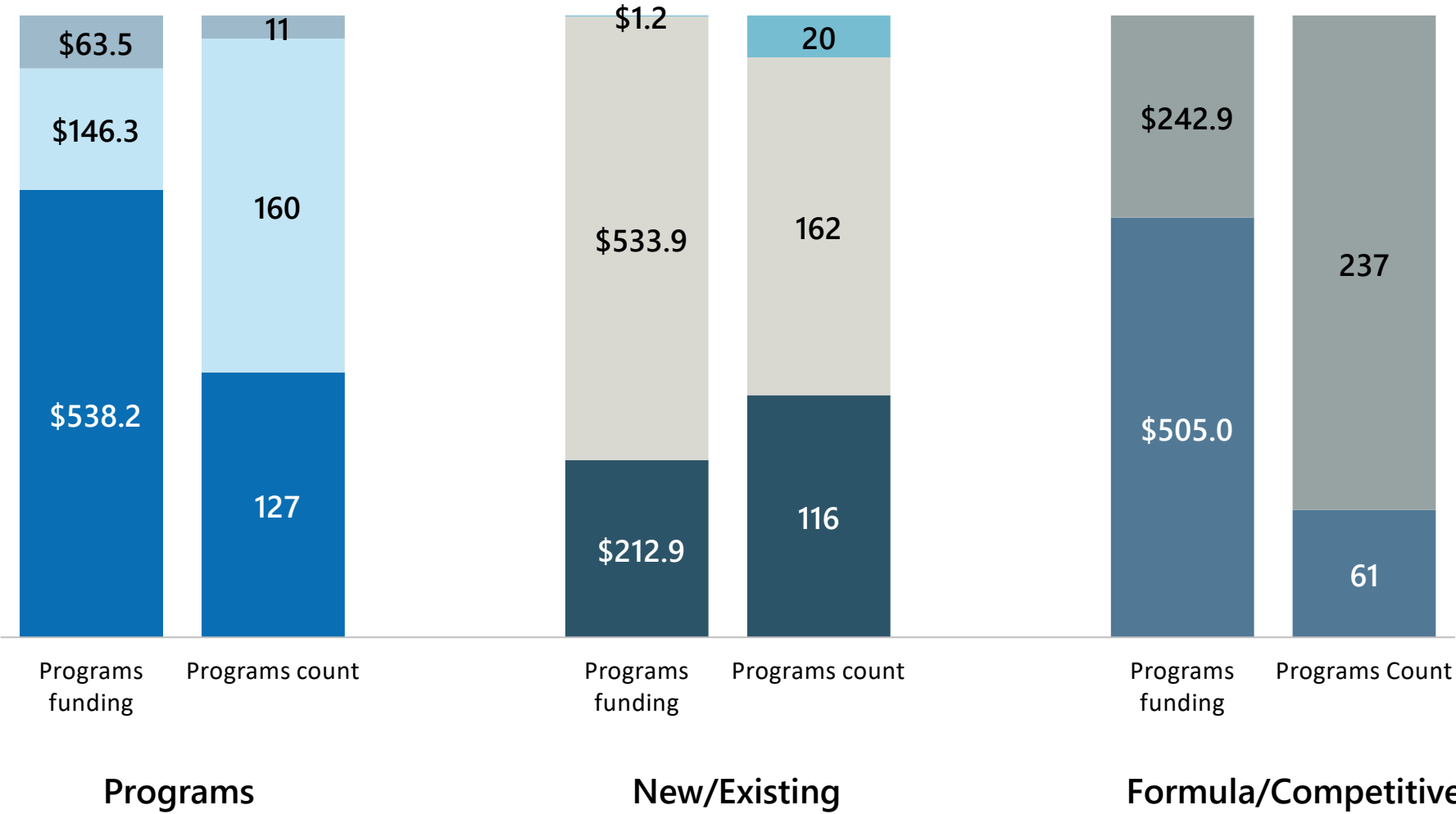

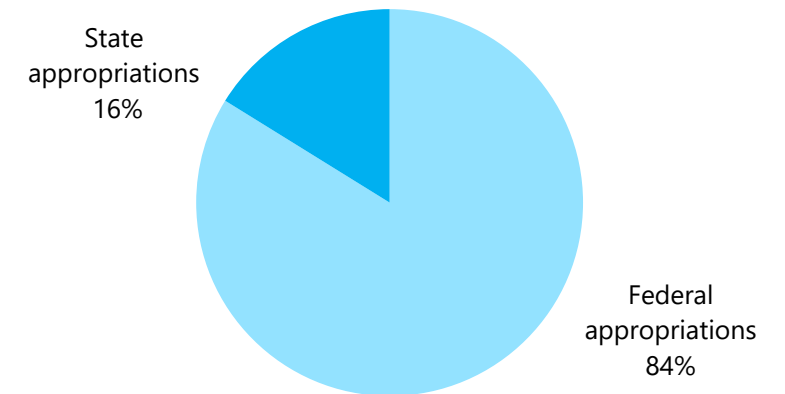
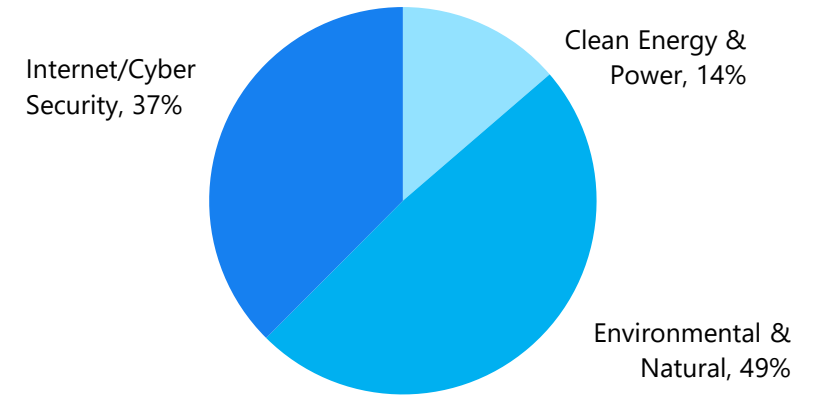
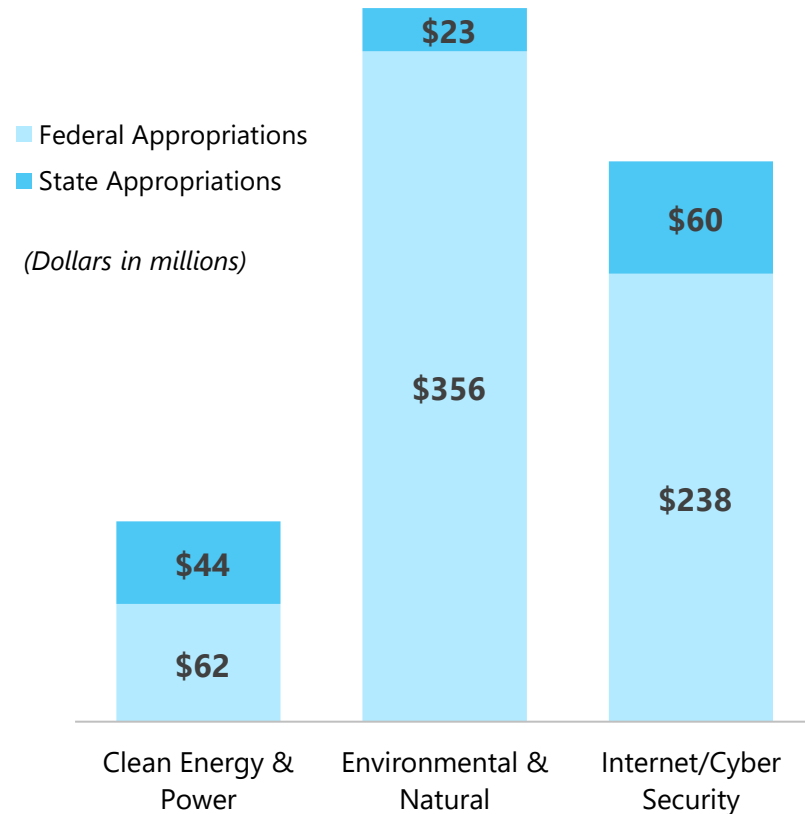
State IIJA Appropriations - Transportation

- Approximately \$5.5 billion federal-aid formula program funding over a five-year authorization.
- Approximately \$1.7 billion more in federal-aid funding than was included in the Fixing America's Surface Transportation (FAST) Act.
- Funding splits between the state and local.
- 100% budgeted in the financial plan and projects list.
- Total appropriations through 2025: **\$454 million.**

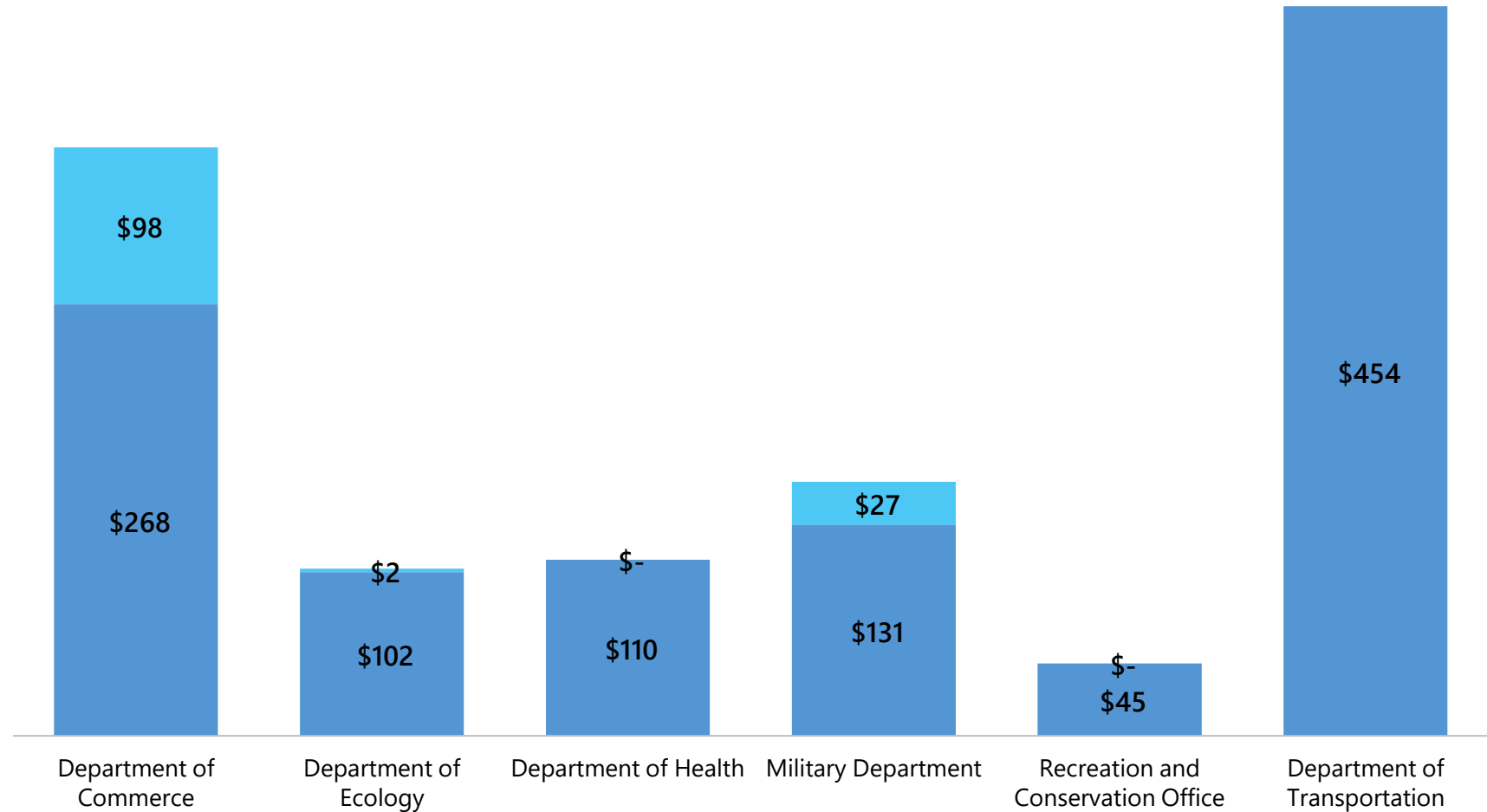


State IIJA Appropriations by Agencies

Inflation Reduction Act (IRA) Overview

- 25 new programs (about 44%) contain 68% of the total grants funding.
- 4 formula grants programs, 53 competitive programs.

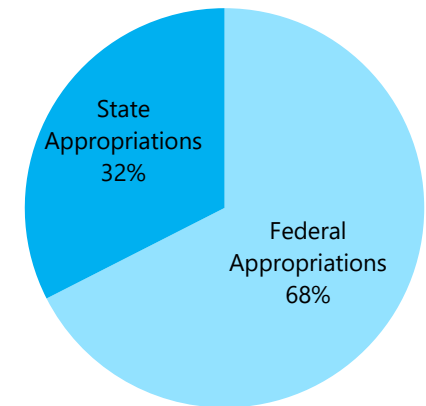
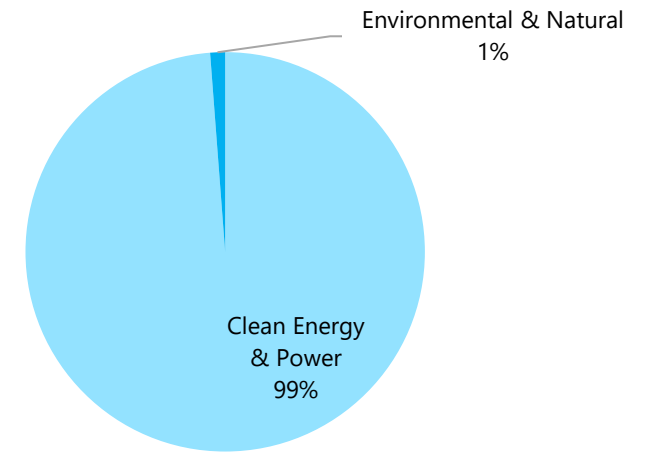
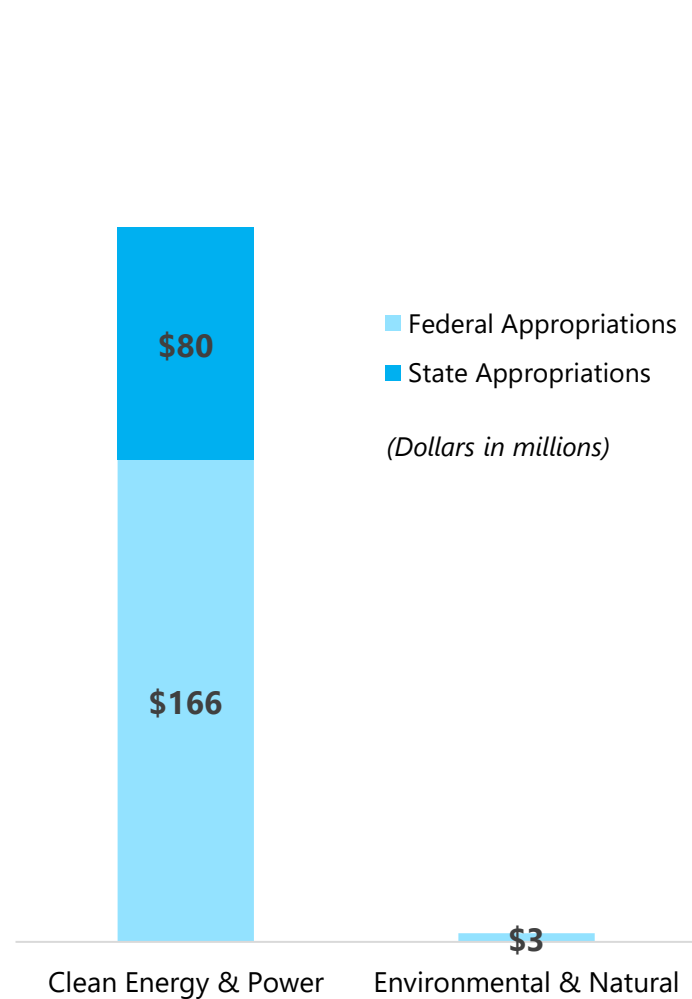

CHIPS & Science Act Overview

The US Department of Commerce manages [CHIPS for America](#) program and Tech Hub program that are biggest competitive programs in the CHIPS and Science Act.

- CHIPS Incentive Program: \$39 billion
- CHIPS Research and Development: \$11 billion
- EDA Regional Technology and Innovation Hub Program: \$10 billion
