#### Most of SAMHSA funding goes to the States via Block Grants. The Tribal portfolio is specific to eligible Tribal Entities.

- Community level discretionary grants are limited, but SAMHSA did push out a large Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinics (CCBHC) grants at this level.
- Most grants are for a five-year period.



## **NOFO: Notice Of Funding Opportunities**

#### **Grant Review Process**

SAMHSA uses peer reviewers who are subject matter experts and generally not SAMHSA employees. Peer reviewers evaluate discretionary grant applications. <u>Visit "Grant Review</u> <u>Process" to learn more.</u>

SAMHSA conducts oversight activities
