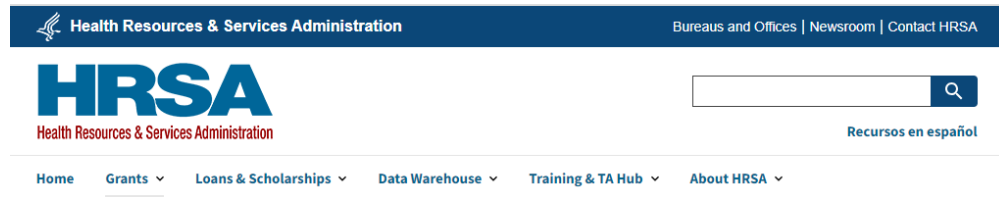

Grant Opportunities

Most of SAMHSA funding goes to the States via Block Grants. The Tribal portfolio is specific to eligible Tribal Entities.

- Community level discretionary grants are limited, but SAMHSA did push out a large Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinics (CCBHC) grants at this level.
- Most grants are for a five-year period.
