- Executive Order 11645 1974 (President Nixon)
- Minority Business Development Agency (MBDA) is an agency of the United States Department of Commerce working on behalf of the nation's minority-owned firms in support of their growth and global competitiveness

Mission:

- Washington MBDA services help overcome these challenges for Women and Minority Business Enterprises (W/MBEs):
 - 1. Underutilization of MBEs in Public Contracting
 - 2. Private Sector Discrimination
- Narrow the contracting disparities:
 - Increase access to contracting opportunities: jointly pursue solicitations, advocacy, education, early access, and matchmaking with project owners
 - Build contracting capabilities through education, training workshops, direct external spending on technical assistance to increase MBE competitiveness.
