Office on Violence Against Women

Provide federal leadership in developing the nation's capacity to reduce violence against women and administer justice for, and strengthen services to, victims of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, and stalking. Created in 1995 to implement the Violence Against Women Act (VAWA) and subsequent legislation.

In FY 22, OVW administered 19 grant programs – 4 formula and 15 discretionary.

Awarded over \$10 billion in grants

In FY 23, awarded 800+ awards totaling more than \$627 million

Serve hundreds of thousands of victims each year

Legal Assistance for Victims Program (LAV)

In 2023, the LAV Program awarded more than \$39.6 million to 55 organizations.

Funding

Will be used to provide victims with access to appropriately trained legal representation. LAV supports the provision of comprehensive legal services.

Eligible Applicants

-Private nonprofit entities.

- -Indian tribal governments, including tribal consortia.
- -Tribal organizations. Territorial organizations.
- -Publicly funded organizations not acting in a governmental capacity, such as law schools.

Priority Areas

Priority consideration will be given to applications for which the lead applicant is a culturally specific organization.



Transitional Housing

In 2023, the Transitional Housing Program awarded more than \$43.1 million to 81 organizations.

Funding

Will be used to provide victims with access to transitional housing for 6-24 months, follow-up supportive services for 3-12 months after exit, limited legal financial assistance, and voluntary support services for 6-24 months

Eligible Applicants

- -States and units of local government
- -Indian tribal governments and organizations
- -nonprofit organizations
- -domestic violence or sexual assault coalitions -other victim service providers

Priority Areas

Priority consideration will be given to projects serving underserved populations.
