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Direct Funding

In some cases, EPA makes awards directly to CBOs and non-profit organizations

Funding through existing partnerships

EPA funds state, local, and tribal governments to lead environmental programs

"Fund the Funder"

This funding format reduces the barriers to access EPA funding

All funding formats support EPA's mission to protect human health and the environment

PROGRAM OBJECTIVES



Implement ambitious measures that will achieve significant cumulative greenhouse gas (GHG) reductions by 2030 and beyond



Achieve substantial community benefits (such as reduction of criteria and hazardous air pollutants), particularly in low-income and disadvantaged communities



Complement other funding sources to maximize these GHG reductions and community benefits



Pursue innovative policies and programs that are replicable and can be "scaled up" across multiple jurisdictions

COMMUNITY CHANGE GRANT PROGRAM

<u>The activities to be performed under the Community Change Grant program are</u> <u>expected to fall under the following categories:</u>

- Climate resiliency and adaptation.
- Mitigating climate and health risks from urban heat islands, extreme heat, wood heater emissions, and wildfire events.
- Community-led air and other (including water and waste) pollution monitoring, prevention, and remediation.
- Investments in low- and zero-emission and resilient technologies and related infrastructure.
- Workforce development that supports the reduction of greenhouse gas emissions and other air pollutants.
- Reducing indoor toxics and indoor air pollution.
- Facilitating the engagement of disadvantaged communities in state and federal advisory groups, workshops, rulemakings, and other public processes.

<u>COMMUNITY CHANGE</u> <u>GRANT PROGRAM</u>

The entities eligible to apply under this Notice of Funding Opportunity are:

- A partnership between two community-based non-profit organizations (CBOs).
- A partnership between a CBO and one of the following:
 - a Federally-Recognized Tribe
 - a local government
 - an institution of higher education.

Up to 150 grants that are 10-20 million each and an additional 20 awards at 1-3 million each.

12 month rolling application, closing on November 21, 2024



EPA Partnership with the Department of Energy and is a part of the Federal Interagency Thriving Communities Network.

177 million dollar, 5-year program, to stand up technical assistance centers to provide training, and capacity-building support for Tribes, community organizations, interested parties, and community partners with Environmental Justice concerns.

<u>THRIVING</u> <u>COMMUNITIES</u> <u>GRANTMAKERS</u> <u>PROGRAM</u>

Funds up to 11 "grantmakers" nationwide to provide grants to community-based nonprofits for assessment, planning, and project development.
