

Total to date: >\$1.5 Billion

*Totals includes state dollars: Round One Working WA Grants (\$10 million), and \$10 million for tribal assistance from state funds

COVID funding to Small Businesses

Working Washington Grants:

- Round One: \$10 million, supported 1,508 businesses (state funds)
- Round Two: \$10 million, supporting 1,574 businesses & \$5 million to ADOs
- Round Three: \$100 million, supporting 7,931 businesses
- Round Four: \$240 million, supporting 11,728 businesses
 - Border Business Relief Program (just closed): \$2.6 million, supporting 206 businesses
- Round Five (Spring 2022): \$50 million

• Other programs:

- Resiliency Round: \$18 million; supported 2,646 small businesses
- Flex Fund: \$30 million from the state, \$40 million from private sector
- Ag programming: \$16 million, supported 839 small businesses

Lessons learned

- Ensuring there is technical assistance for small businesses as they interface with government programs (e.g. language access);
- Need continues to outweigh available resources for assistance and additional support on local capacity is critical.
- Importance of data to track outcomes and equitable distributions of funds.



















Small Business Resiliency Network Coverage

Small Business Flex Fund

A <u>low-interest loan</u> that can be spent flexibly, including on payroll, utilities & rent, supplies, marketing & advertising, building improvements or repairs, and other business expenses. Able to borrow up to \$150,000.

- Open to businesses or non-profits;
- Must employ 50 or fewer full-time equivalent (FTE) employees;
- Must have suffered a direct economic disruption as a result of COVID-19 in a way that has materially impacted operations;
- Must have been in operation for at least one year prior to the date of application or the non-profit must have been in operation since at least January 2019;
- A limited amount of start-up financing is available for for-profit businesses.

STEP Export Vouchers Overview

The <u>State Trade Expansion Program (STEP)</u> is funded in part by the U.S. Small Business Administration to help offset the cost of small businesses conducting business internationally

- Maximum award amount: \$10,000 per company/per grant cycle
- Mandatory 25% cash match reimbursement grant
- Up to 3 applications per year

Eligible expenses include:

- International trade show or mission fees (virtual or in person)
- International business travel (airfare only)
- Compliance testing of an existing product into an export market
- International website design, development, and translation
- International marketing and advertising, including product videos
- Translation of marketing media
- Services of the <u>U.S. Commercial Service</u>
- Costs to join WA Department of Commerce Trade Shows

STEP Export Voucher – Next Steps

1. Check Company Eligibility

- Meet the SBA criteria for a "small business concern" companies can check by their NAICS code on the <u>SBA</u> website
- In business for at least one year
- Demonstrate export readiness
- Registered to do business in Washington State
- 51% US Content or of US Origin
- 2. Complete an application at (Export Voucher Program Washington State) and return to Nicole Gunkle (Nicole.Gunkle@commerce.wa.gov)
- Apply at least 4 weeks in advance of starting your international export project

3. Application Process

- Applications are reviewed twice a month and companies are notified of status
- If awarded, can begin incurring expenses and submit for reimbursement within 30 days of activity completion
- Fill out surveys twice a year to report on successes



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
